HOLY COMMUNION — HOW

For the conclusion on the articles of Holy Communion, let's look at HOW we should receive Holy Communion. Even though this seems like a trivial matter to write about, it should be a very important matter to each of us. You are about to receive the greatest gift from God — HIS SON, HIS BODY AND HIS BLOOD, in the form of Bread and Wine. So how should you receive this gift? The following are my thoughts on this subject, you will not find them in any church rules, regulations, etc. However, I feel deeply on this subject, both as a Catholic and Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister. There are three things we will cover. Because of the importance of this subject, it will be covered in the next two bulletins.

First, would you go to the doctor to get a physical with dirty hands? Hopefully, the answer is a resounding NO! Therefore, when you come to the altar of the Lord, come with clean hands. I know that this may seem almost comical—but please do take the time to wash your hands. I realize that people who work with their hands may at times have the evidence of their hard work ground into their hands, to the point that it cannot be “washed off”. I'm not talking to them—I'm asking that if you've been outside working in the yard, or inside working around the house, take the time to thoroughly wash your hands with soap and water before coming to church!

Second, when we are approaching the Eucharistic Minister, please do it in a reverent manner. This includes thinking only about what you are going to be receiving in a matter of moments—not sharing a sign of peace with people on the way up to the altar, saying hello, etc. Instead, walk with your hands folded and eyes ahead as you approach this great gift.

Third, and now you are standing in front of the Eucharistic Minister. . .

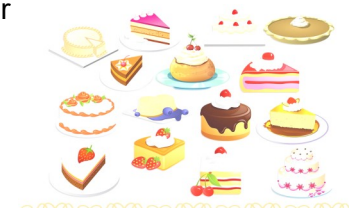
