LIVES OF THE SAINTS

CONTINUED. . . Even though the United States is considered a “baby in the history book of saints”, we can already boast several Americana born saints. The first saint on this American list is St. Elizabeth Seton. St. Elizabeth Seton was NOT a cradle Catholic (Cradle Catholic is anyone born into the faith as opposed to converting to Catholicism at some point in their life.) How did Elizabeth become a saint?

✓ Born August 28, 1774, daughter of a physician in New York.

✓ Married William Seton in 1794. They had 5 children and moved to Italy for his health. Unfortunately, he died shortly after arriving in Italy.

✓ Because of her experiences and acquaintances she made in Italy, Elizabeth converted to Catholicism in 1805.

✓ As a widow, she was faced with many difficulties, including problems supporting herself and her children and being shunned by friends and relatives for her new faith.

✓ Operated a school for boys which lead to an invitation from a priest to open a school for girls. This lead to long held hope to found a religious community, the Sisters of St. Joseph, the first American-based Catholic sisterhood.

✓ She continued to teach and work for the community until her death in 1821.

✓ The road for Elizabeth to be declared a saint began in 1882 when James Cardinal Gibbons of Baltimore took the first step toward having her so honored. In 1959 (yes 77 years later!) Pope John XXIII declared Mother Seton Venerable and in 1963, Blessed. On Sept. 14, 1975, Pope Paul V I named Elizabeth Seton a Saint of the Church.

✓ She is the patron saint of widows and young brides because she was both a young bride and a widow. Her feast day is January 4.

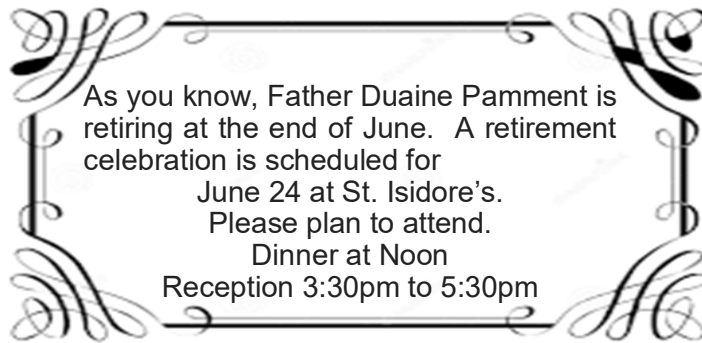
