HOW IS THAT DONE & WHY?

Are you aware that at every Mass, special linens or clothes are used? Have you ever wondered what they are called, are there different clothes and why, and who cleans them and how is it done? We can become complacent about items that are used during Mass. We may not even be aware that there are special linens used and they must be treated differently than the usual "Monday Morning Laundry". So let's look at our Mass linen and how they are cared.

LINENS—NAME & PURPOSE:

CORPORAL: A large, square white cloth which is placed on the altar underneath the chalice, ciborium and paten. It is folded in such a manner to catch any crumbs or drops that may fall from the sacred vessels.

PURIFICATOR: A long narrow piece of folded linen cloth, with a small cross sewn on it, used by the priest to wipe the chalice after he drinks from it. There are other white clothes without a cross sewn on them that are used by the Eucharistic Ministers when they are distributing the Precious Blood. After each communicant receives from the cup, the rim of the cup is wiped with this cloth.

CARE OF THE LINENS:

Have you ever been in the sacristy? This is the room in our church hall where Father prepares for Mass, extra supplies for Mass are kept and a double sink. Have you wondered why there is a double sink in this room? One side of sink drains into a septic system or public sewer. The other sink is called a "sacrarium". This side of the sink drains directly into the ground! The reason for this is that when we wash the sacred vessels and some linens used at Mass, they must first be rinsed in the sacrarium. Why? These sacred vessels and linens that have come in contact with the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus must be treated with special reverence, just as we treat the bread and wine—that is now the Body and Blood of Jesus — with special reverence, so must these vessels and linen be treated with that same reverence! After these clothes have been rinsed in the sacrarium, they are then taken home by a volunteer to be completely washed. If they have not been rinsed at church, at home, they must be rinsed in a basin of water that is then poured out on the ground in a reverent manner. They are washed separately from all other laundry, dried, ironed and folded in a special way. We are in need of more volunteers to care for the altar linens. If you are interested in volunteering, please speak to either Deacon John or Father Ray.
