HERE COMES THANKSGIVING. . . . and with it comes so many traditions: gathering of family and friends, football games, a wonderful meal, sharing memoirs and stories, nap time, and then on to the rest of the holiday season. But before we go to the rest of the holiday season, here's a few Thanksgiving facts that you can use at your next Trivial Pursuit Game.

⇒ The Pilgrims didn't dress with buckles on their shoes or wear only black and white clothes. Actually the women dressed in a variety of colors: red, green, blue and violet, and the men wore a variety of colors too. ⇒ The tradition of celebrating Thanksgiving did not start in 1621. Nobody at the time thought of that meal as a start of a new tradition. ⇒ In 1789, George Washington declared Thursday, Nov. 26th, a Thanksgiving holiday. But it was only for that year and wasn't connected to the Pilgrim feast. It was intended as a "public thanksgiving and prayer". ⇒ The pilgrims Thanksgiving meal featured venison, fish and some sort of fowl, but not necessarily turkey. Pumpkins were available, but unlikely that the colonists whipped up a pie. Also, they didn't know about sweet potatoes and they may had cranberries served, but not as a relish! ⇒ Sara Josepha Hale, editor of the Godey's Lady's Book for 40 years, 1837 to 1877, was a highly patriotic person who read about the Pilgrim's feast and became captivated with the idea of turning it into a national holiday. She published recipes for turkey, stuffing, and pumpkin pie, thus started traditions that had nothing to do with the colonists. ⇒ President Abraham Lincoln set Thanksgiving as an official holiday to be celebrated on the 4th Thursday of November every year. But President Franklin D. Roosevelt agreed to move the holiday to the 3rd Thursday of November to help the depression economy by making the Christmas shopping season a little bit longer. However, there was so much opposition that two years later it was changed back to the fourth Thursday in November. ⇒ And finally, if you say that eating turkey makes you tired —no, no, no! An essential amino acid, tryptophan, is thought to have a sedative effect. Yes, turkey does contain this amino acid, but no more than any other food, including chicken! So even if the tryptophan does induce tiredness, there isn't enough in the turkey that you ate to do so. So if you yawn after dinner, don't blame the turkey. It might be the appetizers, side dishes and dessert — just saying!
 Hope you had fun reading about the holiday and that you can this trivia if there is a lull in the conversation at the table!
