### July 21, 2019 • Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

We are blessed today with stories about relationships—human and divine—and the joys and responsibilities that come along with them. They are also stories about justice.

Our Gospel tells the familiar story of overly anxious Martha complaining to Jesus about her sister, Mary, who is not helping her with her hospitality responsibilities but is sitting at Jesus' feet. Can't you just imagine Jesus between these two righteous women disciples?

Jesus' answer to Martha—that the actions of her seemingly lazy sister are actually OK—hardly seems fair. As we will show later, caring about the responsibilities that come with treating others well brings rewards, but there is a difference in how one approaches the task.

### THOSE WHO DO JUSTICE

Psalms 15 describes the life of justice and the reward of joy in God's presence. We know that justice always involves service. Can we find joy in service, perhaps even in suffering?

Saint Paul writes to the Colossians that his life of suffering service to them and to the other churches is a source of joy

to him. His relationship with them, although filled with affliction, is its own reward, as he brings people into relationship with Jesus Christ.

Abraham and Sarah, the righteous elderly couple of the Old Testament, are emblematic of this kind of relationship. Abraham welcomes "strangers" with eager hospitality, not knowing that his visitors are divine messengers, even the Holy One of Israel! His spouse, Sarah, does all she can to aid Abraham in making their guests comfortable and welcome. In return for their generous hospitality, the childless aged couple are rewarded with a blessing—a son, Isaac.

How do they differ from Martha, though? Martha allows her duties and service to overwhelm her with anxiety. Abraham fairly leaps for joy to be of service to his guests.

If you are a Martha, the lesson is to keep serving but find the joy that gives true meaning to your service.





# Notes from Fr. Bob Bacik

I hope that you are enjoying the summer the warm weather we have been having. If you find yourself burdened by the heat and humidity, just remember Christmas is just 5 months away!

Today we focus on the story of Martha and Mary. Martha and Mary were sisters and they were friends and disciples of Jesus. Martha is associated with action and service. Mary is associated with contemplation and listening. Both service and contemplation are important, and notice that Jesus asks Martha to guard against anxiety and worry. Mary listened to Jesus. In what ways can we strive for a balance and ask God to help us to manage our anxieties?

Thus, they were Jesus' grandparents! Though nothing is spoken of them in the Bible, from all reports Anne and Joachim must have been faith-filled persons --- how else could Mary be chosen from all women to be the Mother of the Savior? Let us ask Saints Joachim and Anne's intercession on all of you who "serve" as grandparents— such a privileged and important role in the formation of our next generation!

**RACISM:** We've heard a lot in the news recently about what is and what is not racism. A homily is brewing on the topic, but the time is still to come. We as Catholics must be continually committed to working to uproot racism in our society and in our own lives. Instead of pointing the finger, let us ask God for continued healing in our families and community. I'd like to share with you a prayer that I recently discovered:

## **PRAYER FOR UNITY AND JUSTICE**

O Lord our God, in our mercy and kindness, no thought of ours is left unnoticed, nor desire or concern ignored. You have proven that blessings abound when we fall on our knees in prayer, and so we turn to you in our hour of need.

Surrounded by violence and cries for justice, we hear your voice telling us what is required, "Only to do justice and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God" (Mi 6:8). Fill us with your mercy so that we, in turn, may be merciful to others.

Strip away pride, suspicion, and racism so that we may seek peace and justice in our communities. Strengthen our hearts so that they beat only to the rhythm of your holy will. Flood our path with your light as we walk humbly toward a future filled with encounter and unity.

Be with us, O Lord, in our efforts, for only by the prompting of your grace can we progress toward virtue. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.


