

September 15, 2019 • Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Who would leave the ninety-nine in order to seek out the one, lost sheep? We sometimes read or see accounts of missing children. We cannot really grasp the feelings of the parents or family members. Their world stops. Their hearts ache. The parents do not forget their other children, but for a time, their focus is solely on the one who is missing. They join the search party, or sit anxiously by the phone, waiting for news of the return of the child. It is this sort of love that Jesus describes in the parable of the lost sheep. And yet, Jesus told the parable in response to criticism by Pharisees and scribes because he was welcoming sinners and eating with them. So, in Jesus' parable, the sheep is not accidentally lost. The sheep has strayed. And still, the shepherd went out in search of it. The sheep is precious to the shepherd, even though it had wandered away. Like the Israelites in the desert who had created idols in Moses' absence. Like us, when we turn away from God and God's ways, doing what we feel like, rather than what we know is right and good.

REJOICING WHEN THE LOST ARE FOUND

The shepherd in the parable leaves the ninety-nine to seek out the one who had wandered, and only returns home when that one, that precious one, had been found. All are precious in the eyes of the shepherd. The woman turned her house upside down in order to find her lost coin and, upon finding it, called her friends and neighbors. Jesus welcomed sinners and ate with them. Have you wandered away, through your actions or inactions? Jesus' parable assures us that there is great joy in heaven when the lost one repents. Turn back to the Lord, and know that there will be great rejoicing in heaven upon your return.

Dear Friends:

Year of Prayer: As you may recall, at last year's diocesan assembly, Bishop Boyea announced a Year of Prayer for the diocese with the intention of discerning how each parish is called to form its members as a community of missionary disciples. I have begun to see fruits of this initiative in our own parish. Although the Year of Prayer will soon come to a close, we have much work to do to advance the mission of our parish community. I continue to encourage all parishioners to pray the rosary at some regular interval (daily, weekly, monthly). I believe our parish would be transformed if more of us took up this practice as individuals, families and as a community.

New Statue: I am excited to announce that we will be erecting a beautiful statue of Our Lady of Lourdes along the southern wall of St. Isidore Church between the chapel and main entrance of the church (notice the blue tarp and yellow tape marking where the foundation is being laid.) I hope this new addition to our campus will inspire our hearts towards prayer and remind us of the power of the rosary. Funding for this project has been largely provided by an anonymous donor. I invite all parishioners/ families to join in this effort by making a commitment to (a) pray the rosary on a monthly, weekly or daily basis and (b) if able, make a contribution of at least \$15 towards the statue (100 additional donors needed at this level). Excess donations will be allocated towards improvements in the sanctuary. Special envelopes are available at both entrances.

K of C Rummage Sale: Another impressive year for our Knights of Columbus Rummage Sale! Once again we raised over \$5,000 to support the various charitable activities of the Knights in our parish and larger community. There are dozens of volunteers who gave many hours of their time to make this sale successful— THANK YOU! Steve and Mary Izdebski deserve a standing ovation for their work on this fundraiser over the past several years.



The first step— called the Inquiry Sessions— will begin SEPTEMBER 29 at St. Isidore. During this process no commitments are made— this strictly is an "inquiry" period where questions are asked and answers provided by trained catechists. 
WINGS—WOMEN'S MEETING

MOVIE NIGHT is coming back to the Holy Family,




