SAINTS. . . The process to become a saint has been discussed before. There are several steps that a person goes through before becoming declared a saint in the Catholic Church. Although we were just told during a homily recently that everyone in heaven is a saint — there is a procedure that the church follows when declaring a person a saint here on earth. Here are some interesting “saint facts”.

~Did you know that on June 19, 1988, St. Pope John Paul II canonized 117 martyrs!

~Although they died at different times, they were all canonized on that date.

~Among those canonized on that date, there were 96 Vietnamese, 11 Spaniards and 10 French people.

~This group of holy people included bishops, priests and lay Catholics.

~Which group numbered the largest? The priests? The bishops? Or the ordinary Catholic serving their faith? If you guessed anything but the ordinary Catholic, you would have been wrong. The ordinary person — like you and me — became a Canonized Saint!

Let us all continue to be the best servant of the Church by trying to do your best every day. During this month of November, remember to pray for all who have gone before us, pray that they are in heaven with our Lord this day, and pray that the saints will help you with your needs and wants by interceding for us to God.

Dear Heavenly Father, Thank you for the example of the Saints. I desire to join in their company, worshipping you forever in Heaven. Please help me follow their footsteps, and yours, Jesus Christ. Please help me to conform myself to Your image, seeking Your will in all things as the Saints did.
