AND SO IT BEGINS. . .yes, Lent has started. Of course, with Lent comes “Lenten” meals. Coming from a Polish family, Friday meals were actually enjoyable when my mother made

that wonderful Polish dish, PIEROGI! If you have ever had any, you know what I mean—let’s just say that they make a Lenten meal that may not be considered as giving something up! Did you know that there is even a patron saint of pierogi?

St. Hyacinth was a Polish Dominican priest and missionary who worked to establish and spread religious communities in his native Poland. He was born in 1185 in southwestern Poland to a noble family. He studied at prestigious institutions in Krakow, Prague & Bologna, eventually earning the title Doctor of Law & Divinity/ He later traveled to Rome and witnessed a miracle performed by St. Dominic. He entered the first Dominican monastery and in 1220 he received the religious habit of the Order of Preachers from St. Dominic himself. He was then sent back to his homeland to spread the faith. Legend of his travels throughout Poland tell the story of his visit to the village outside of Krakow in 1238. During his time there, a hailstorm destroyed all the crops in the village and left the people in famine and poverty. Hyacinth told the people to pray to God that they may be saved from what would be certain starvation and on the next day new crops rose from the Earth. To show their gratitude, the people treated the saint to fresh pierogi made from the newly sprouted wheat. Another legend tells of him feeding people with pierogi during a famine caused by an invasion of Tatars in 1241. An old-time saying in Poland arose from the tales of the saint’s assistance in dire times: “Święty Jacku z pierogami!” meaning St. Hyacinth with Pierogi!

And now you know the rest of the story!
