Notes from Fr. Anthony ...



Well I suppose I should throw a few words in the bulletin this week. One little thing to keep in mind is that June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Sacred Heart is a continual reminder of the great love that Christ has for us, his people. If you look at a picture or statue of the Sacred Heart, you will see that it shows a flame coming from the heart of Christ. That flame is a symbol of His love, the intensity and strength of it, that His heart is consumed with this love that our good Lord has for us, that it is literally burning with love. You will also see in the image of the Sacred Heart a crown of thorns around the heart of Christ. This symbolizes the suffering His heart goes through, suffering for our sins, but also for the indifference and the lack of the return of that love by so many people. It tells us that His heart suffers, His love suffers for us and because of us and that He takes that on Himself – that He will suffer for us out of love, as He did on Calvary. To imagine what kind of love our Savior has for us! How good is He to us, His poor flock that wanders so often. There are a number of devotions directed towards the Sacred Heart and the most prominent of these are: the First Friday devotions – which consists of going to Mass, receiving communion on the First Friday and going to confession every month. There is also the Litany of the Sacred Heart - which is one of the older litanies that has been prayed for hundreds of years now and enumerates the different aspects of Christ and His sacred Heart. And there are many other pious exercises besides these. What are we doing to celebrate this month of the Sacred Heart in our homes? ***Jesus meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto thine.***

To close, I just want to remind everyone of the Eucharistic procession we will be having on Corpus Christi. It will be at Holy Family after Mass next Sunday and will take place outdoors. It would be good to see as many of us there as possible as we celebrate the fact that we have the incarnate Son of God among us in the Eucharist and that we can come together as a parish to implore God's blessings and mercy on our world, to be able to make some reparation to the Sacred Heart for those who spurn His love or willful despise it. Will we take the extra steps to evidence a little more fully our desire to be with Him, to proclaim to the world that we truly believe He is here? Are we doing everything we can "To make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation: to it be glory and honor forever." Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!
