Notes from Fr. Anthony

Happy Pentecost to all of you! This weekend we celebrate the coming of the paraclete, the advocate promised by Christ to His apostles and His Church. When the Holy Spirit descended upon those gathered in the upper room, 50 days after the resurrection, the world changed forever. The one Church founded by Iesus Christ began its missionary activity of proclaiming the Gospel and baptizing in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. The sacraments began to celebrated in the world, in particular the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Mass, the memorial of Calvary. This new Church soon became the foundation of a new world and we see in our own day the consequences of the departing from the Faith as a foundation for our society and world. The evil that roams the earth causing confusion, destruction and death can only be overcome with the weapons of faith - the rebuilding of our country and world on the solid rock of Christ and His Church and Commandments. This Pentecost, let us call upon the Holy Spirit to renew our trust and confidence in God's Divine Providence. To help us live without fear, to strengthen us to once again take up the great work of rebuilding a Christian civilization from the ruins of the modern-day world. To build it on the rock of Christ and not the sand of personal opinion or passing fad. All things are possible with God. The Father and the Son have sent us the Holy Spirit for this reason, to be living temples of God's glory and signs to the world of His presence and to go forth boldly into the battle with sin and evil, knowing full well that Christ will triumph, that His Church will survive and the true Faith will never be overcome.

Let us keep before our eyes the words of St. Paul to Timothy in his second letter: For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God. He saved us and called us to a holy life, not according to our works but according to his own design and the grace bestowed on us in Christ Jesus before time began, but now made manifest through the appearance of our savior Christ Jesus, who destroyed death and brought life and immortality

to light through the gospel, for which I was appointed preacher and apostle and teacher. On this account I am suffering these things; but I am not ashamed, for I know him in whom I have believed and am confident that he is able to guard what has been entrusted to me until that day. Take as your norm the sound words that you heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard this rich trust with the help of the holy Spirit that dwells within us.

- Congratulations to Deacon John on the 10th anniversary of your ordination, may God bless you and reward for your service to His people.
- On Memorial Day, this Monday, we will be having a 9:00 am Mass at our St. Isidore Cemetery. Hopefully you can join us as we give our thanks to God for our freedoms and pray for those who sacrificed so much for us and our country. Please bring your own chairs to sit in at the cemetery.
- On June 11th we will be celebrating the great feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, commonly called Corpus Christi. As last year, we will be having a procession after the 11:00 Mass at Holy Family. We will most likely begin the procession around 12 so please come if you can, even if you are going to Mass at a different time, you could still come and walk in the procession and pray with us. On that note, there are always 4 altars set up for the procession and this year we have parish groups taking care of 2 and are asking families from the parish to volunteer for the other 2. This is a great time for your family to help set up an altar and show some special love to a particular saint your family has a devotion to. 
