Notes from Fr. Anthony

Anyone up for some more heresy?

This week we are going to look once again at the scriptures and the heresies already coming about in the early Church in the lives of the Apostles. This time we will be looking at the first named heresy and group of heretics pointed out directly by St. John in the Apocalypse – the Nicolaitans.

Christ, speaking to St. John points to the angel of the church in Pergamum, in the book of **Revelations 2, 14-15**: "Yet I have a few things against you. You have some people there who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who instructed Balak to put a stumbling block before the Israelites: to eat food sacrificed to idols and to play the harlot. Likewise, you also have some people who hold to the teaching of [the] Nicolaitans." If we take a look at the footnote in the Bible after that passage we find: *Like Balaam, the biblical* prototype of the religious compromiser (cf. Nm 25:1-3; 31:16; 2 Pt 2:15; Jude 11), the Nicolaitans in Pergamum and Ephesus (Rev 2:6) accommodated their Christian faith to paganism. They abused the principle of liberty enunciated by Paul (1 Cor 9:19-23). These same types of groups are mentioned in the Second letter of Peter chapter 2 and in the Letter of Jude chapter 11. We find a similar situation in Revelation verses 18-20: "To the angel of the church in Thyatira, write this: The Son of God, whose eyes are like a fiery flame and whose feet are like polished brass, says this: "I know your works, your love, faith, service, and endurance, and that your last works are greater than the first. Yet I hold this against you, that you tolerate the woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, who teaches and misleads my servants to play the harlot and to eat food sacrificed to idols."

The Nicolaitans are a group we don't know much about, however there is the theory that it was started by one of the deacons ordained by the apostles and some of the Church fathers hold this view. While we are not certain about *which Nicholas*, we can assume it was started by <u>a Nicholas</u> as movements are often named after their founders and heresies later on are often named after the heretic that started them. Regardless, we see in both of these passages a similar accusation of the heresies and the sexual immorality that is part of them, along with the eating of foods sacrificed to idols.

St. Irenaeus, who lived in the second century, discusses them but adds nothing to the Apocalypse except that "they lead lives of unrestrained indulgence." (Against Heresies I.26.3 and III.11.1). What we find in our times that takes its roots from these things is the moral relativism that we see in our own Church and among many Christians in general. The attempt to justify everything with "well MY God is loving and not concerned with those outer things, only with the heart" as if those two parts of us are exclusive from each other. The idea that one can lead a life of "unrestrained indulgence", as St. Irenaeus points out, and still somehow consider oneself a follower of Christ is self defeating. The emphasis placed by the Apostles and early Church has always been that it is the inner and the outer matter, one's heart as well as one's actions and behaviors, even one's way of dressing is meant to reflect that one belongs to Christ. Moving forward, we will see how these first heresies really went on to become the basis for many of the later heresies and the issues we are seeing in our own time.
