Part I

In the first centuries the heresies were predominantly Christological (dealing with Christ, His natures, His humanity and Divinity and so on) and there were also Trinitarian heresies (dealing with the Trinity, the relation between Persons, equality between them and so on). The Christological heresies often ended up with becoming Trinitarian heresies, as Christ is the second person of the Trinity after all. Now we come to a heresy that gave rise to a number of heretical groups in relatively quick succession and it began as Christological heresy but ended up giving rise to a Trinitarian heresy. The name generally given to the heresy as a whole is the **Monarchian heresy** and they are distinguished as **Dynamistic**, or **Adoptionist**, **Modalist** Monarchians, or Patripassians [Sabellians]. This heresy is mainly of the second and third centuries and is often called simply Sabellianism.

Today we are going to look at **Dynamic Monarchi**anism, which teaches that God is the Father and that Jesus Christ is only a man. They teach a form of Adoptionism; that Jesus Christ was tested, passed, and adopted by God the Father who then gave him certain supernatural powers. They teach that the Holy Spirit is merely a force of God the Father, and not the third Person of the Trinity. Their original name was the **Theodotians**. This heresy is the forerunner of the Sabellian heresy. The founder of this heresy was a leather-seller of Byzantium named Theodotus. He place in the Church today. came to Rome under Pope Victor (c. 190-200) and he taught that Jesus was a man born of a virgin according to the counsel of the Father, that He lived like other men, and was most pious.

All of this looks to be in accord with Catholic doctrine. however there is already visibly a denial of the Divine nature if Christ that was present at His birth in human form. More problems begin with his teaching about what followed those truths, mainly that at His baptism in the Jordan the Christ came down upon Him in the likeness of a dove, and therefore wonders - this is where the use of the name to describe the heresy as dynamistic comes from were not wrought in Him until the Spirit (which Theodotus called Christ) came down and was manifested in Him. They did not admit that this made Him God; but some of them said He was God after His resurrection. What this is saying is that Jesus the man was not also Jesus the God, but that a separate spirit - which was God - basically adopted the body of the man Jesus. So, in summary this heresy is often called "Adoptionism" because of the belief that the **body** of the man who was Jesus was basically "adopted" by the Spirit and it was through this spirit that all the miracles and such came about.

Heresies start for different reasons, most often because of intellectual pride but also because of the mixing of the teachings of the Church with other pagan religions or as a simple matter of convenience. We will finish this up next week with a little more on Theodotus, the roots of his heresy and some current comparisons to what is taking
