

Notes from Fr. Anthony



Onwards.

It is truly amazing how many heresies there have been in the centuries of Christ's Church. We are only looking at the bigger ones in the group, but it is mind boggling to see how many there really were, even down to our own present time. Looking at the first couple centuries alone, as we have been recently, we need to keep in mind that the Church was fighting a war on two fronts - persecution from the pagan empires and the Jewish people all while trying to evangelize at the same time and on the other front continued heresies erupting. Any student of this aspect of Church history would have no problem seeing and accepting the fact that the Roman Catholic Church is the Church Christ founded, because any human founded church would have either split into many denominations or ceased to exist in the face of such consistent and sustained attacks from the beginning on its teaching and dogma.

After our last little trip through the heresy of Theodotus, we find the next major heresy to crop up was also started under a period of severe persecution. *Less than 50 years* after Theodotus and shortly after the Sabellian heresy and the first anti-pope in the Church's history, we have a new one cropping up. In the 3rd century AD we have a deacon named Novatian in Rome (surprise!) who starts out in a very strong, orthodox Catholic position. He is archdeacon of the Church in Rome and as such is noted for his learning and courage n the face of persecution, he is a witness of the martyrdom of a number of Christians in the vicinity and these moments really impress upon him the need for courage in the face of the persecutions. Now that is all fine and well, however he starts becoming more radical as time goes on. There was apparently an issue earlier when he was ordained a priest without ever having received the Sacrament of Confirmation that comes up as well. By 251 AD he is of the position that certain sins are unforgivable by the Church, sins such as the idolatry ordered by the government under pain of death. While those who fell into this could be **readmitted** to the church, they could **never again** receive the Eucharist because only God would be able to forgive them. This is what comes to be called the **Lapsi controversy** (latin for "lapsed"), which was: could those Christians who lapsed into idolatry or betrayed their faith or fellow Christians to save their lives during the persecutions be for-

given of their sin by the Church? The basic premise of Novatianism was stating that there were sins, besides that sin against the Holy Spirit, that Christ did not give His Church the power to forgive. The actual pope, St. Cornelius, emphasizes that Christ had given His Church on earth the power to forgive sins, even grievous mortal sins. We see in the Scriptures that this is a reality: John 20, 21-23: [Jesus] said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Matthew 16, 18-19: "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

As a result, Novatian and his followers were excommunicated from the Church. This controversy caused quite a bit of division in the Church. Novatian and his followers basically split the Church and had their own pope and their own bishops and parishes, all which had been previously part of the whole Church. This situation lasted for a number of years after the death of Novatian and Novatianism persisted until the 7th century. Novatian himself ended up dying a martyr, so he had a courageous, deep faith; unfortunately, he died outside of the Church due to his inability to accept that Christ gave His Church the power to absolve even the sins of those who in their fear or cowardice abandon Him when they are truly contrite and repent of their faithlessness. The devil will use pride in any way he can - even to fool or mislead those who have a deep faith - to cause division and tear apart the Church, the spotless bride of Christ. He attempts to get us to either make no use of the opportunity to receive forgiveness of sins in the Sacrament of Confession or to believe that there is no possibility for us to be forgiven on this earth. The truth is that Christ died for our sins and instituted the Sacrament of Penance for our sake, to offer us a sure opportunity to know we are forgiven and to increase the grace to follow Him and strengthen the hope that we can achieve eternal life.




WHENYOUPRAY
