



A whopper

One of the largest heresies to hit the church up until the time of Martin Luther was the heresy of Arianism. It finds its beginning in the at the end of the 3rd century / the beginning of the 4th century and is built upon many of the same foundations of the other heresies we have gone over thus far, the main point being an outright objection of the Divinity of Christ as consubstantial with the Father and therefore a problem with the Trinity. It takes adoptionism, novatianism and modalism and the rest of them to the eventual conclusion they were heading toward. Arianism is started by a priest by the name of Arius, who was born in Libya. He lives between the years 250/256 - 336 and dies in Constantinople. There is a particular group today that pushes the idea that Arius really wasn't that big of a deal and that all the raucous is really the fault of St. Athanasius. Those are blatantly erroneous positions though and they attempt to minimize the great damage done by the Arian heresy. So first let us take a look at the history of it and try to better understand the situation.

The heresy begins officially around the year 300 and doesn't start to fade from the mainstream of the Roman Empire for almost a hundred years but pops up time and again up until the 19th century. This heresy is particularly interesting in how fast it spread and how quickly it literally took over the empire. At first the emperor Constantine the Great fought the Arian

movement, however, after his death the next leaders of the empire were followers of Arianism and the heresy even went so far as to have a pope sympathetic to the ideas and following him two antipopes. It was accepted by the emperors of Rome, and they put their strength behind those bishops who supported Arianism, which resulted in the persecution, exile and sometimes martyrdom of any who held onto the true faith. To understand how quickly Arianism grew, St. Jerome, the famous Bible scholar and translator (342-420), once said: "The whole world groaned and was astonished to find itself Arian". St. Athanasius is one of the most well-known warriors against Arianism. He was constantly writing and preaching the true doctrine of the Church and for this he suffered much. He was persecuted by the Arians and exiled multiple times following the council of Nicaea where he took a public stand against the doctrine of Arianism. This is where we have the Nicene Creed that we say at Mass every Sunday from, it first is authored in 325 at the council and is later slightly modified at the council of Constantinople in 381 when Arianism is again officially condemned and by this time is finally being purged from the Church.

That is where we will close this week and next time we will look at what the doctrine of Arianism is.
