Notes from Fr. Anthony



I figured I would try and scribble down a few words for the bulletin this week while I am on retreat. What is a retreat? It is a time set aside for silent prayer, meditation, spiritual reading, the celebration of the sacraments and conferences meant to help one grow in the spiritual life and the knowledge and love of God. The priest retreats directed by **Opus Angelorum** are intense and not for the faint of spiritual heart (or physical for that matter). They do specific retreats for priests, for the laity and for families - where the schedules are obviously different. They are also the ones tasked with spreading devotion to the Angels and they also prepare people for the Consecration to the Guardian Angel and the Consecration to All the Angels. I have done both and I highly recommend them for everyone, including children. Those consecrations are a great help to the spiritual life at all stages.

To be honest, every year I find myself initially not looking forward to going on retreat because there are always so many things I have to do and I feel like if I had that week to do those things, I would be better off. This is not true, and after all I know it is nothing more than the devil trying to find a way to get me to put off going or not go at all because he knows how important this is for my spiritual life and my ability to faithfully live my vocation as a priest and pastor of souls. While I am extremely aware of how much I still am lacking in that vocation, every retreat helps that spiritual life to grow a little deeper and to return to the parish spiritually rested, renewed and ready to get back in the ring. The success of and the ability of the retreat to do this very much depends on how one approaches it and whether or not it is taken seriously. As I mentioned above, there is always the temptation to not go or put it off. After I heed the advice of my Guardian Angel and go, it is almost as if time slows down and grinds to halt. Although it is only 5 days, it really does feel much longer and by the third day I have this desire in my soul to just stay there forever. That is part of the battle, being able to leave and come back to everyday life. It really drives home to me how much the apostles must have loved spending time with Jesus, how hard it must have been for them when he was not physically there. Take for instance the storm on the sea when they were alone and afraid. They thought they were done for and then they see Him on the water. Or when he first appeared to

them after His Resurrection when they were gathered in the upper room with the door locked so no one could enter. Or how they pleaded with Him to stay with them when the time for His Ascension was at hand. That is what it feels like on a good retreat directed by holy priests, the desire is to not have to go back to regular life, but to just stay there with Christ in that deep union with Him in the silence. But alas, as Christ with the apostles, one has to continue on the journey that the Good Lord has started you on. One must return to the valley in order to climb the next hill and meet Him again on the next peak. Such is our pilgrim way, but each time our Good Lord gives a little deeper knowledge of Him and gives more grace to make that fire of love - which has been suffering through the constant attempts of the world to douse it - once again bright and intense. So, we move forward as good soldiers in the army of heaven. During the breaks on retreat is when I try to do some serious spiritual reading. I always read a couple of books during this time and one of the books I read this year was "Blessed Charles of Austria, a holy emperor and his legacy" that was a Christmas gift from my sister - it was a spectacular read and you will hear more about this amazing saint in the future. Thank you for the prayers this last week!
